By making a **VTE** risk assessment the gold standard at your medical establishment, you can save lives.

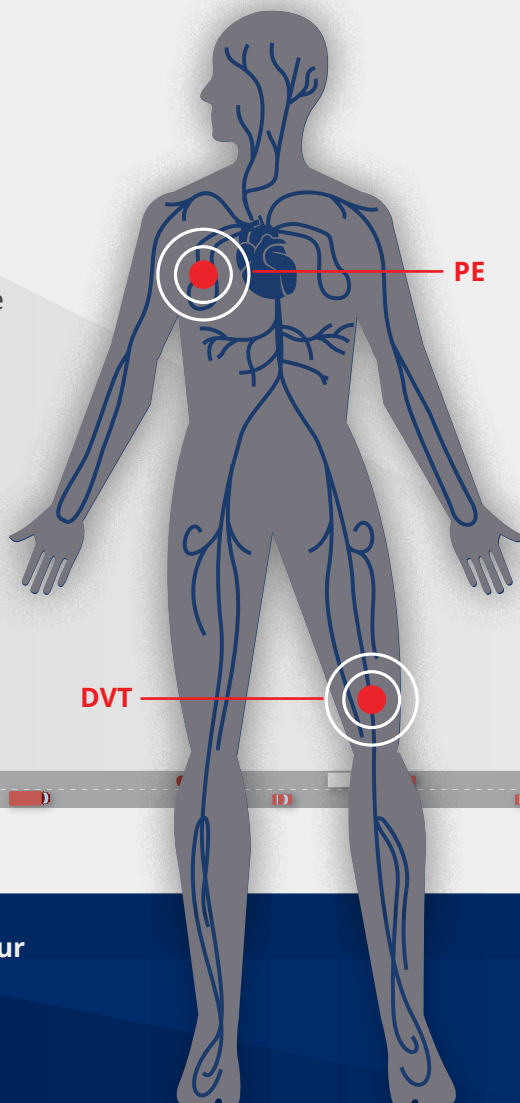
KNOW THE RISK FACTORS. KNOW THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS.

DO YOU KNOW THROMBOSIS?

VTE is a condition in which blood clots form (most often) in the deep veins of the leg (known as deep vein thrombosis, **DVT**) and can travel in the circulation and lodge in the lungs (known as pulmonary embolism, **PE**).

SILENT ILLNESS

This illness is often "silent" and can mimic other common conditions such as heart attack, pneumonia, and anxiety. Its aftermath spans a wide spectrum from inconsequential to fatal.



A PUBLIC HEALTH PROBLEM

VTE is a significant public health problem, but it can be preventable. Be proactive. If a patient is admitted to the hospital, or having surgery, they should receive a **VTE** risk assessment using an evidence based method.

STRONG RISK FACTORS

- Hospitalization
- Surgery
- Cancer
- Prolonged Immobility
